Now, this weeklong trip awards students with firsthand exposure to some of the best historical monuments in Washington, D.C., and a better understanding of the structure and importance of electric cooperatives, all while establishing new and lasting friendships.

## Meet Mattea

The daughter of Roughrider Electric members Brent and Lindsey Hysjulien, Mattea is a high school sophomore from Hazen. She enjoys golfing, playing softball, tubing and jet skiing at the lake in the summer.

This upcoming trip to Washington, D.C. marks her second visit, and she appreciated seeing the monuments on her first trip, especially the Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial and Holocaust Museum.

"I am happy I have been there before and know a little history of the monuments," she says.

Her dad, an employee of Roughrider Electric, encouraged her to apply for the trip. Intrigued by the chance to delve deeper into American history, Mattea chose to focus her essay on the Declaration of Independence.

"The Declaration of Independence stands out to me as a pivotal moment in history. Studying it in school left a profound impact, and its significance has always fascinated me," she says.

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### Mattea's winning essay

One moment in American history I wish I could have been part of is the signing of the Declaration of Independence in 1776. This significant event defined the beginning for a new nation and set the base for the principles of freedom and democracy we still care about today. I would have contributed by engaging myself and speaking for the equality of all people. I would have confirmed the importance of equality for the future of the nation and the need to make certain these morals were maintained.

If I had the opportunity to be a part of this historic event, I would have contributed in four ways. Firstly, I would have made the importance of individual rights and liberties known. The Declaration of Independence boldly pronounced "all men are created equal" and are entitled to "life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness." The idea that governments derive their power from the consent of the governed was a revolutionary concept at the time. I would have worked diligently to ensure the language was used effectively to show the desires and values of the American people. The journey toward independence required the cooperation of individuals from diverse backgrounds and perspectives. # SAFETY STARTS WITH ME: **Tree trimming**

Overgrown trees and branches pose a significant risk to the reliability of our power supply and can often result in unplanned outages. Roughrider Electric Cooperative strives to balance maintaining natural beauty with ensuring a reliable power supply. Through clearing of power lines in rights of way, our proactive vegetation management serves to safeguard safety, reliability and affordability for our cooperative members.

# Safety

Overgrown vegetation and trees present a significant risk to power lines. If trees are touching power lines in our members' yards, they can pose grave danger to families. For instance, if children have access to these trees, they may inadvertently enter a danger zone by climbing them. This situation can be very dangerous, because electricity can arc or jump from a power line to nearby conductors like trees, heightening the risk of accidents and injuries.

## Reliability

Of course, one of the biggest benefits of a smart vegetation management program is reliability. Strategic tree trimming reduces the frequency of downed lines causing power outages. Generally, healthy trees don't fall on power lines, and clear lines don't cause problems. Proactive trimming and pruning keep lines clear to promote reliability.

"At Roughrider Electric, we take a proactive approach to tree trimming, which also helps us diminish the chances of fallen branches or trees during severe weather events that make it more complicated and dangerous for lineworkers to restore power," says Warehouse Technician Casey Cook.

# Affordability

Roughrider Electric is a not-for-profit cooperative, which means we strive to control our costs to keep our rates affordable. This extends to our approach to vegetation management. If trees grow too close to power lines, the potential for expensive repairs also increases. Effective tree trimming and other vegetation management efforts keep costs lower for everyone.

# Here is what YOU can do

There are ways you can help Roughrider Electric limit tree trimming.

By planting trees in the right place from the start based on their expected height, you can help reduce the need to trim trees near overhead power lines. If



you're planting shrubs, bushes or other vegetation near transformers, remember to plant at least 4 feet away from the transformer sides and at least 10 feet away from the transformer door.

Our community is a special place. We appreciate the beauty trees afford, but we also know our community depends on us to provide reliable energy. If you spot an overgrown tree or branch dangerously close to power lines, let us know by calling us at 800-748-5533. Through vegetation management, we are better able to keep the power lines clear, prepare for future weather events and secure the reliability of the grid.

# Roughrider Electric board meeting highlights: Feb. 20

The meeting of the board of directors of Roughrider Electric Cooperative was held on Feb. 20 at Roughrider Electric's Dickinson office. The meeting was called to order at 10:03 a.m. MST. A quorum was present. Roughrider Electric's counsel, Jennifer Grosz of Cooperative Legal Services PLLC, was appointed recorder for the meeting. Also attending were co-General Managers/CEOs Travis Kupper and Jason Bentz, CFO Alex Craigmile, Director of Key Accounts Leonard Hibl, Line Superintendent Shawn Olson and Board Liaison Connie Hill.

Consent agenda: There were no additions to the agenda. The board approved the agenda as presented.

Strategic/action: Bentz and Kupper presented the co-general managers' report, which included updates on their visit with Basin Electric Power Cooperative, Innovative Energy Alliance's annual meeting and a summary of the North Dakota managers winter meeting. January reports for West Dakota Utility Services and 3C Construction were reviewed. The co-general managers also provided Basin Electric's CEO report.

Action items: There were no agenda additions.

Discussion/general information: The board approved the wildfire mitigation plan as presented with no changes from 2023. The Cooperative Family Fund and the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association International Program were also discussed.

Department reports: Craigmile provided the CFO report with relevant financial information. Olson provided the board with an update on his written operations report, noting Roughrider Electric received its bucket truck ordered in 2021 and providing other operational updates. Chief Information Officer Charlie Dunbar provided director training. Grosz presented an update on the status of projects addressed in her written legal report.

The meeting concluded with the adjournment. President Greg Steckler certified the accuracy of the minutes.
