Making a difference a few cents at a time: **Hazen Public School LEGO League**

Each year, Roughrider Electric Cooperative members have the opportunity to round up their electric bills to the next highest dollar. The difference gets deposited to Roughrider Electric's Operation Round Up fund.

Twice a year, the Operation Round Up board of directors meets and distributes grants to a variety of worthy causes in Roughrider Electric's service area. Since its inception in 2002, Roughrider Electric's Operation Round Up has been able to give back \$685,000 to its service area.

Hazen Public School LEGO League

One of the community programs Operation Round Up funds assisted is the Hazen Public School (HPS) LEGO League. The Operation Round Up funds helped the club with expenses for student competitions.

"The funds helped purchase new LEGOs, materials for presentations, as well as shirts for competitions," says Alison Peterson. HPS LEGO League advisor.

The LEGO League is an after-school robotics program for students in grades five through eight.

The HPS LEGO League is part of FIRST LEGO League, which is a worldwide STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) learning experience for students. Each year, FIRST LEGO League unveils the theme for the season. The 2023-24 theme is "MASTERPIECE." which focuses on creative arts.

"These competitions are a chance for students to work together and be challenged," Peterson says.

About 20 HPS students take part in the after-school activity of LEGO League, which is enough students for two teams, including a fifth-grade team and a team for the other grades. Students work together to decide who is going to take on the roles of designer, builder, coder or creator.

"There is a lot of collaboration and teamwork that goes into these activities," Peterson notes.

Each team receives a base model robot and gets to work, choosing the mini missions from the season's theme. HPS LEGO League will attend a regional competition in early 2024, where the students will not only have a robot ready for a mission, but will also have a skit ready to aid in the presentation of the

robot design to judges.

"Seeing the students' faces when we go to competitions, and they are able to interact with students their age who have the same interests as them, is really rewarding," Peterson says.

More than building

"LEGO League gives HPS students additional opportunities to work as a team and build lifelong skills," Peterson says.

LEGO League is a hands-on learning experience for students to learn teamwork, problem-solving, researching, coding and countless other skills that will assist them in their high school and young adult years.

"We live in a rural community and getting these STEM skills in front of students as soon as possible is important to building future careers in our community," Peterson says.

Safety Starts with ME: **Holiday lighting tips**

Amid the cheer that defines the holiday season, holiday lighting is one tradition bringing warmth and radiance to our homes. As we prepare to deck the halls and string those festive lights, it's vital to remember safety is the true star of the show.

"We know this is an exciting time for people to get ready for the holidays, but we want members to take a couple of things into account when decorating, including safety and light selection," says Anthony Schaff, meter technician at Roughrider Electric Cooperative.

Most holiday decorations involve some installation at heights, so it is important to keep the following in mind while decorating indoors and outside:

- Have a ground crew (one or two people) to steady your ladder and pass up the decoration, which is an invaluable part of safety and to keep you supplied with untangled light strings, fasteners and encouragement.
- Remember to keep a safe distance from your overhead electric service.
- 3. Don't overreach. If you cannot get to a point with your body completely centered between the sides of the ladder, get down and relocate the ladder.
- 4. Don't overextend the ladder. If your ladder is too short, rent or borrow a longer one. A ladder extended beyond its working limits is dangerous, as is standing on rungs too close to the top.
- 5. Do not overload circuits by stringing more light sets together than the manufacturer recommends. Check the packaging for details.



6. Check your wires for breaks and cracks in the insulation that can lead to shorts.

Roughrider Electric board meeting highlights:

Sept. 29, 2023

The September meeting of the board of directors of Roughrider Electric Cooperative was held on Sept. 29 at Roughrider Electric's Dickinson office. President Greg Steckler called the meeting to order at 9 a.m. Roughrider Electric's general counsel. Jennifer Grosz, was designated as the meeting recorder. Board quorum was met. Also present were Roughrider Electric Co-General Managers/CEOs Travis Kupper and Jason Bentz, Chief Financial Officer (CFO) Alex Craigmile, Director of Key Accounts Leonard Hibl and Board Liaison Connie Hill. The meeting commenced with the board reviewing Roughrider Electric's mission statement.

Consent agenda: Amendments were proposed to the consent agenda. The agenda was approved as amended. The Aug. 25 meeting minutes were also approved. Capital credit estate retirements, proposed member applications and cancellations were presented and approved.

Strategic/action: Bentz and Kupper presented the co-general managers' report, which included updates from the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association Region 5-6 meeting and a Basin Electric Power Cooperative update.

West Dakota Utility Services, 3C and Basin Electric's CEO reports were presented by Bentz and Kupper.

Action items: The board reviewed and approved the 2024 capital budget and a few annual financial items.

Department reports: Craigmile reviewed the August financial reports. Craigmile also stated the 2024 budget is being drafted. Shawn Olson, line superintendent, provided a written report, which included load inquiries, line inspections and new services. Hibl presented a report, which included an update on the *North Dakota Living* Study Committee meeting. Chief Information Officer Charlie Dunbar and Grosz provided reports, which were also reviewed.

Discussion/general information: Upcoming meetings and events were shared.

The board then entered into an executive session.

The meeting concluded with the adjournment. Troy Sailer, secretary, certified the accuracy of the minutes.

Next meeting date: The next meeting date was set for Oct. 27 at Roughrider Electric 's office in Hazen. ■
